Dear Parents, Students and Friends

Welcome back to school for Term 2. Many thanks to the parents who attended the recent Parent Teacher Meeting, which we trust was both useful and effective for all who participated, and that specific feedback on student progress and how to improve their grades was helpful. STAFF NEWS

Heartsaver First Aid, CPR and AED

First aid training is part of ACS (International)'s efforts to ensure safety and security of our students and staff in school and in activities outside school, including excursions, camps, educational trips and service-learning journeys. Five members of our staff have been added to our list of first-aid trained staff this year. The teachers are Ms. Gaye Hazel Kirby (House Mistress of GHK and organizer of US Trip 2018), Mr. Tse Ren Lim (House Master of LSG and Trip Leader for Japan CAS 2018), Ms. Emma Murray (Zimbabwe CAS 2018 supervisor), Ms. Chantal Roux (Vietnam CAS 2018 supervisor) and Mr. Antonio Inigo (UK CAS 2018 supervisor). They received their Heartsaver First Aid, CPR, and AED Course certificate from the American Heart Association for successfully completing the cognitive skills and evaluations in accordance with the curriculum of the American Heart Association Heartsaver Program. We now have at least 2 staff members in each school building and at least one in each CAS trip and other trips organised this year who are certified first-aiders.



The training was held on 10 March 2018 and was facilitated by Mr. Adrian Tan from International SOS. It included the duties, roles and responsibilities of the first aid rescuer and the steps of first aid on cases such as choking, severe allergic reaction, stroke, heart attack, seizures, shock, external bleeding, adult and infant cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED).

The next training for a new batch of teachers will be held in Semester 2.

Launch of Callido for Year 5

At ACS (International), we are constantly innovating and investing in our students' development. One such initiative is our partnership with Callido Learning, a leading provider of online learning resources for IB schools.

All students in Year 5 have now begun their Callido program, and are in the process of completing online modules to develop their research and writing skills. Beginning this course alongside the launch of the Extended Essay, Year 5 students will develop the independent and critical research skills necessary for them to excel in this area.

In the IB Diploma, students' performance on their examinations and internal assessments depends on their ability to demonstrate critical thinking, research and academic writing skills across different subjects.

The Callido program helps:

- (1) Assess each student's individual ability on these skills;
- (2) Teach students techniques which they can apply to all their subjects;
- (3) Give students the freedom to learn anytime and at their own speed; and
- (4) Monitor and measure their improvement.

Students can also qualify for a certificate from an Ivy League faculty, which will help them in university admissions.

All students will continue to have access to the platform for a period of 12 months, enabling them to refer back when required for assignments and examinations. Students will be required to complete certain sections of the module within set time-lines, set in accordance with their Extended Essay deadlines. The deadlines for the initial modules are detailed below. These modules must be completed before students submit their EE research proposals.

World Vision Presentation


During our Morning Assembly on 4 April, we invited a special guest from World Vision to share with our school about the service work that they do around the region.


