Dear Parents, Students and Friends

Three Top in the World awards for IGCSE! These outstanding results from last year’s November examinations were recently announced – very late this year but better late than never! Our congratulations to Wu Yanyu and Wei Yu on their 100% scores and attaining the Best in the World award for Additional Mathematics, and to Rupert Chia on gaining the Best in the World award for International Mathematics. Two other ACS (International) students were only one mark behind in each of these Mathematics subjects.

Being Best in the World in a subject is an outstanding effort and the whole school is delighted in congratulating these students on their supreme achievements which are the result of fine ability and outstanding and sustained effort, particularly over the past two years. We also congratulate their teachers, Mrs Lim-Tan Lay Pian, Ms Jasmine Teo and Mrs Beena George, on their extensive skills and hard work, supported by the whole Mathematics faculty over the past four years that the students have been with us. ACS (International) students have achieved 23 Top in the World awards in 10 of the past 11 years.

Seeing students perform at an elite level in any endeavour is very satisfying, and in terms of academic excellence I am reminded of 2 Peter 1:5 (NIV) “For this very reason, **make every effort** to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, **knowledge**” (emphases are mine). Top performances don’t just happen, but require sustained effort and persistence over a long period to achieve success. As Vidal Sassoon said: “the only place where success comes before work is in the dictionary”! Our three Top in the World students, and their teachers, are the proof of these quotes.

We have now finished Term 3. We especially thank all those who attended the recent virtual Parent-Teacher Conferences (PTCs) which replaced our usual face-to-face Parent-Teacher Meetings as a result of COVID-19 restrictions. Feedback from both staff and parents has been universally positive – but we would need to give staff a few more 10 minute breaks from time to time, and also find a way to accommodate non-English speaking parents who need an interpreter sitting next to them. Any other feedback on these virtual PTCs would be appreciated.

Our thanks to the student leaders, the PSP and wider parent body for their wonderful affirmation of their teachers at this week’s Teachers’ Day celebrations. Celebrations were quite muted this year but the staff did appreciate all the gestures, notes and participating in the prize draw.

We wish everyone a safe school holiday, and we look forward to meeting again on 14 September.

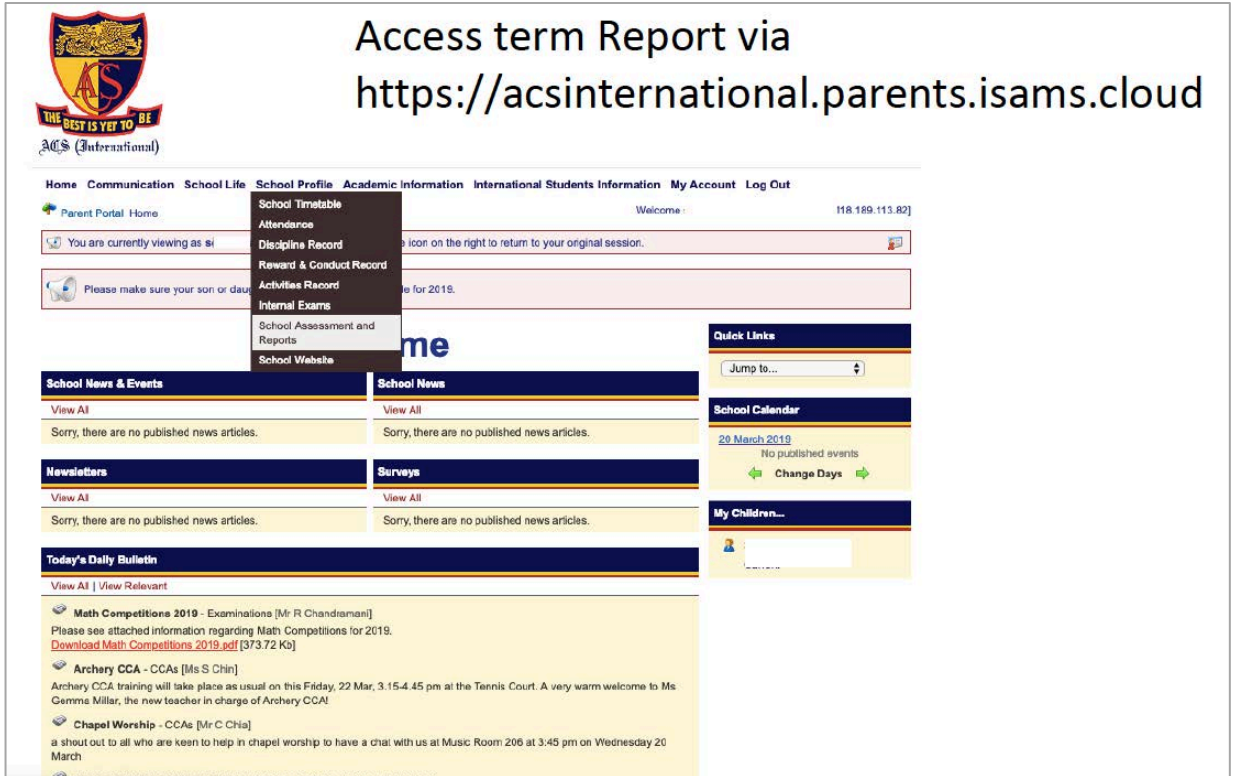

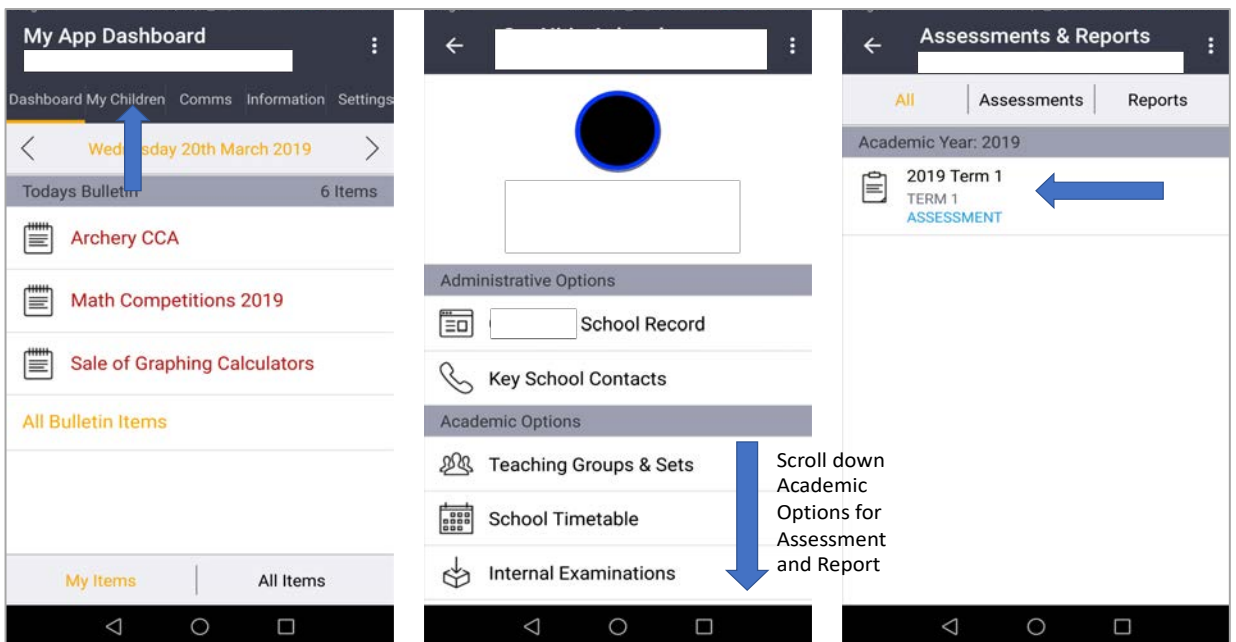
Information for Parents on Firefly

2020 Leadership Colours Awards

To be CONSIDERED for the award of Colours, students must set an example of good conduct, service and leadership, in line with general expectation for the age group they are in.

- show respect for social, cultural and community diversity

II. Modelling the Way

- infuse team/others with energy and confidence
- foster collaborating
- coach or encourage other people
- manage personal and emotional relationships

III. Inspiration

- show positivity in the face of challenges and failures
- celebrate success and managing disappointment
- innovate, experiment, and explore ways to improve
- exude enthusiasm for the work/project/event
- are trustworthy

IV. Achievements (Team or Individual)

- successful completion
- significant achievement/recognition

Students are required to get **at least two teachers/mentors** to endorse the self-reflection/application form (by completing the Supervisor's/Mentor's Evaluation) before submitting it for consideration by Mrs Tan Siew Hoon and another SLT member. The submission deadline for Year 4 (IGCSE only) and Year 6 is **Friday, 28 August**. The last day of submission by other year groups (including Foundation IB and Pre IB) is **Thursday, 1 October**. Please drop the completed form into the box marked "Colours Awards Application Forms" at the General Office.

Step-Up Dengue Prevention Measures

A reminder that as part of the school's continued health and safety measures, fogging is carried out every Saturday at school and granules are laid in potentially infected areas. Everyone is reminded to practise preventative measures to reduce the chances of being bitten.

End-of-Year Exams and Progression to Next Year

The school's internal end-of-year examinations are planned to be held as usual, starting mid-October. We do not expect any change compared to other years. Each subject teacher will confirm details with their classes next term. The examination schedule will be published on Firefly in due course. The examination start dates are published elsewhere in this newsletter.

All students will sit for the internal school examinations at school under secure conditions. There is no scope for students to sit for the papers at alternative times. However, for new students not yet in Singapore and having to study independently in their home country, we are planning to provide an alternative venue at our Regional Offices so that these few students can sit for the examinations at the same time as their fellow Singapore students and under secure conditions. More details later.

Progression to the next academic year level is usually automatic unless there are significant academic concerns or the minimum entry criteria have not been met (e.g. for IB Diploma). The school Progression Policy may be accessed [here](#). Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we plan to be as flexible as possible when considering those cases where progression is in doubt, and each case will be considered on a case-by-case basis. In general terms, progression is based on the whole year's work, not just the performance in the end-of-year examinations.

ACS (International) 2021 IBDP Internal Scholarships

Year 4 students are invited to apply for three 2021 scholarships worth \$10,000 each for the year 2021 only – click [here](#) for the application form.

The successful applicants would have demonstrated:

- Outstanding academic achievement throughout Year 4 (in IGCSE, Foundation IB or Pre IB classes);
- Strong contribution to co-curricular and/or House activities; and
- The ability to achieve highly in the IBDP and give back to the school.

Each scholarship will be used to offset Year 5 IBDP tuition fees. \$5,000 will be deducted from the fees payable for each of the two semesters. Applications to the Principal consisting of a letter of application listing achievements and contributions to the school close on 30 September.

Study Nights

Study nights run from 26 September to 12 November, every Tuesday and Thursday, at the school library. The extended hours till 8:00 pm are solely for Years 4 and 6 students. No other students will be admitted so as to provide a conducive environment for the Years 4s and 6s.

Students are reminded to dress in school attire when using the library. School-related shirts, such as the polo tee and House T-shirts are permitted, and must be worn with the school pants/culottes. PE shorts are not allowed. Students in the wrong attire will be asked to change out before being allowed entry into the library. The PSP has arranged to sponsor an online ordering of food. Details later.

Transcripts and Testimonials

This is the time of the year we begin to receive requests of these two documents. The Academic Secretary, Ms Manwant Kaur, will process these requests upon receipt of the completed transcript and/or testimonial application form, which can be downloaded from the website ([Life At ACS -> Forms & Important Information -> Forms -> Request for Transcript/Testimonial](#)).

A period of 10 days is required to process any document. We regret that we are unable to respond to any request to produce them immediately.

Year 6 students will automatically receive these two documents at the end of the school year. They only need to apply for these documents if they are applying to university before year end. Testimonials are only available for Year 6 students, and Year 4 students who are leaving school. School leavers in other year groups can only apply for a school transcript summary of all school reports.

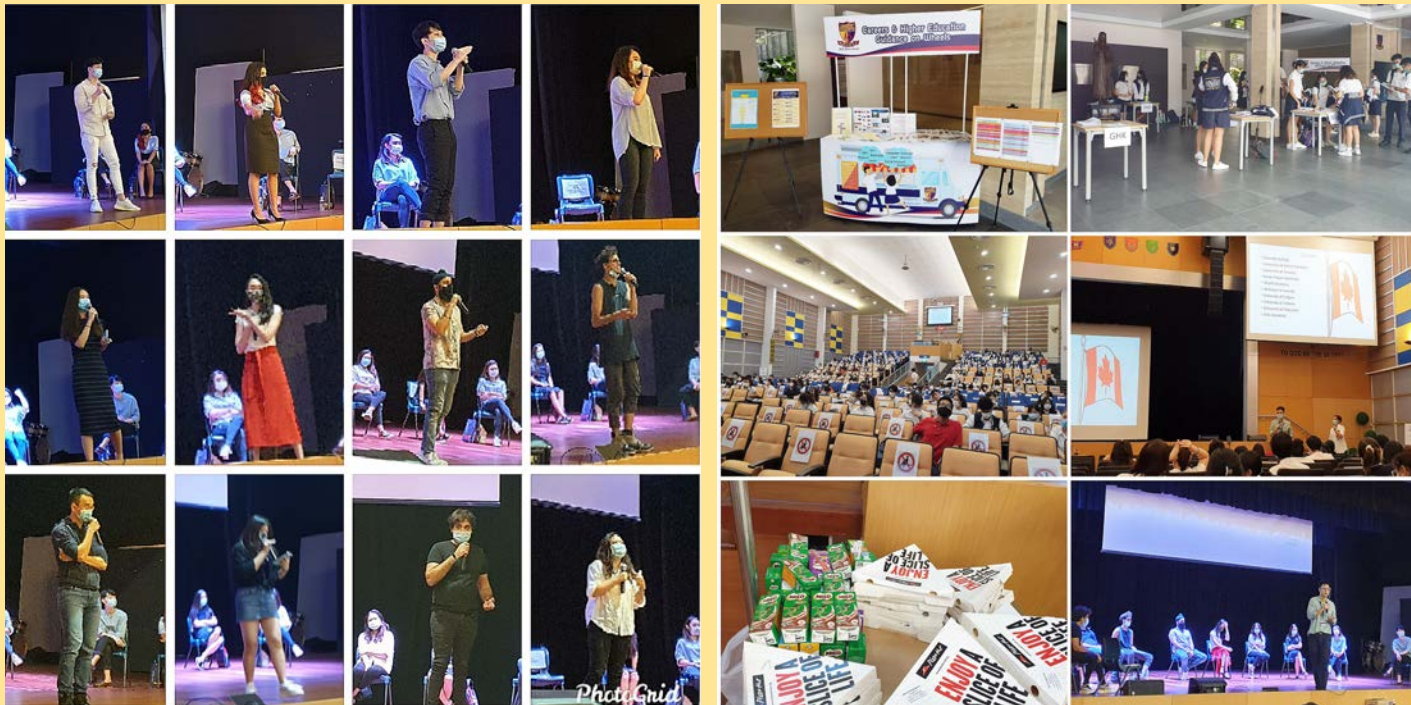
University Application Session 2020
