IGCSE and IBDP Subject Selection Processes

IGCSE

The Subject Selection process commences on Wednesday, 12 August. Year 2 students will be introduced to the process during Tutor Time, with the materials presented in this session made available to parents thereafter on the school website.

Key dates to take note:

- Wednesday, 12 August: Subject selection via online submission opens
- Friday, 18 September: Subject selection via online submission closes
- Wednesday, 11 November: ONLY day for change of subject selection (before 5:00pm)
- Wednesday, 18 November: Receipt of 2020 subject choices

IBDP

Year 4 students (including those in Foundation IB and Pre IB) MUST attend the IB Information Session on 7 August, 12:30pm– 1:30pm, Chapel. Materials presented during this session will be made available to parents thereafter on the school website.

Key dates to take note:

- Friday, 7 August: Subject selection via online submission opens (after IB Information Session has ended)
- Friday, 21 August: Students who qualify for DSA to IBDP informed (or at the latest by Monday, 24 August) via email
- Monday, 24 August: Subject selection via online submission closes (at 5:00pm) [Note: NO subject change is allowed thereafter.]

Update on IGCSE November 2020 Exams

The IGCSE November 2020 exams will proceed unless the majority of schools worldwide are unable to sit. We append the letter from Cambridge International and some FAQs for perusal as follows:

November 2020 series

Cambridge International is planning to run exams for the November 2020 series. We believe exams remain the fairest and most reliable way to assess student achievement and our schools are telling us they want to hold exams if they can. Question papers will start to be dispatched to schools and exam centres soon.

We know many schools are continuing to adapt to the disruption caused by Covid-19, hence we will be as flexible as we can to support students and teachers, so that students can complete coursework and sit exams safely and securely. We are working on a practical guide to support schools running November exams. The guide will be available on our website in August.

We are continuing to monitor advice from government authorities around the world on whether schools can open and exams can be held in October/November. Our regional teams are also in close contact with their schools.

Schools will follow local regulation and health advice, and any that cannot hold exams safely will be able to defer their entries to the next exam series.

In the unlikely event that most candidates cannot sit exams in the November 2020 series, we would work with schools to switch worldwide to the 'assessed grade' methodology, similar to the June 2020 series.

Our key priorities remain the same – to keep students and teachers safe, and help students get on with their educational journeys as soon as possible.

FAQs

Will Cambridge run exams for countries that can hold them, and assessed grades in countries that cannot? We will only run one system.

What will happen if students cannot sit exams but Cambridge is running exams in other countries?

In that case, we will ask students to defer to the next exam series.

What about private candidates who missed exams in June 2020?

Many private candidates will take exams in November, where possible. Some of them deferred entry from June. We are finalising contingency plans to support private candidates in the unlikely event that exams cannot take place.

Syllabus-specific advice for the November 2020 series

We realise many schools are now considering how to manage coursework requirements for syllabuses in the November 2020 series.

For some coursework, speaking and practical components, you will be able to adjust the way you teach the course or administer the test to meet the requirements of the component. This applies to the <u>components listed in this document</u>.

IBDP Subject Information for 2021 Intake

Year 4 students are to register subject choices for 2021 intake this month. Parents and students may use the following link or scan the QR Code to access IB Subject Information and IB Presentation held on Friday, 7 August:

The Subject Options for IBDP need to be completed and submitted online via Firefly using the link that is sent on 7 August via the school email account of the students. Students will be briefed on how to do this on the same day.

Timeline

- Friday, 7 August: Portal opens for subject options to be made
- Sunday, 23 August: Portal closes for subject options to be made, where no option change is further allowed.

Note

- Y4 DSA students will make subject choices based on their Prelim exam results and with reference to future tertiary studies and career.
- Y4 Foundation IB and Pre IB students will register subject choices and they will receive confirmation after their 2020 end of year examinations results are released.
- Y4 non DSA students will register subject choices and they will receive confirmation after their IGCSE results are released in January 2021.

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Direct School Admissions

Prospective students can apply for admission to 2021 classes through our internal admissions tests or based on formal examination results such as PSLE or 'O' Levels taken in 2020.

Direct School Admissions (DSA) applicants for Years 1, 2, 3, Pre IB, Foundation IB and Year 5 can contact the Admissions Department to arrange to sit for English Language and Mathematics entrance tests. All applicants will also undertake an oral interview with a senior staff member. Year 1 applicants who do not pass the DSA process can reapply for admission using their 2020 PSLE results.

Current Year 4 IGCSE

Students have two opportunities to gain admission to the IB Diploma Programme the following year. Those who gain a minimum of 2A, 2B and 2C grades in the preliminary examinations and who have a good work record, will be offered a place by email letter at the end of Term 3. Those who are not offered a place may still gain admission by gaining the same minimum of 2A, 2B and 2C grades in the formal IGCSE examinations that they will sit for in October/November.

Foundation IB and Pre IB students who have already gained 2A, 2B and 2C grades in either IGCSE or 'O' Levels have guaranteed entry to IBDP. Otherwise, they will be offered entry based on their performance in the school's end-of-year examinations that they will sit for in October/November.

Other Year Groups

Applicants for Years 1, 2, 3, Foundation IB, Pre IB and Year 5 can contact the Admissions Department to arrange to sit for English Language and Mathematics entrance tests which are usually held every Monday. All applicants will also undertake an oral interview with a senior staff member. Year 1 applicants who do not pass the DSA process can re-apply for admission using their 2020 PSLE results.

Term 3 Online Parent-Teacher Meetings

Years 4 and 6 (Wednesday, 19 August) and whole school (Monday and Thursday, 24 & 27 August) Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) will be held online this year. Parents will be notified via email in the week of 10 August with details on how to sign up for the online PTMs.

ACS (International) 2021 IBDP Internal Scholarships

Year 4 students are invited to apply for three 2021 scholarships worth \$10,000 each for the year 2021 only – click <u>here</u> for the application form.

The successful applicants would have demonstrated:

- Outstanding academic achievement throughout Year 4 (in IGCSE, Foundation IB or Pre IB classes);
- Strong contribution to co-curricular and/or House activities; and
- The ability to achieve highly in the IBDP and give back to the school.

Each scholarship will be used to offset Year 5 IBDP tuition fees. \$5,000 will be deducted from the fees payable for each of the two semesters. Applications to the Principal consisting of a letter of application listing achievements and contributions to the school close on 30 September.

Transcripts and Testimonials

This is the time of the year we begin to receive requests of these two documents. The Academic Secretary, Ms Manwant Kaur, will process these requests upon receipt of the completed transcript and/or testimonial application form, which can be downloaded from the website (Life At ACS -> Forms & Important Information -> Forms -> Request for Transcript/Testimonial).

A period of 10 days is required to process any document. We regret that we are unable to respond to any request to produce them immediately.

Year 6 students will automatically receive these two documents at the end of the school year. They only need to apply for these documents if they are applying to university before year end. Testimonials are only available for Year 6 students, and Year 4 students who are leaving school. School leavers in other year groups can only apply for a school transcript summary of all school reports.

International Sci-Teens Challenge 2020



During the June holiday, the Anglo-Chinese Junior College (ACJC) Science and Mathematics Council organised the International Sci-Teens Challenge 2020, a science digital video competition to engage youths from all countries to explore the realm of Science and Technology.

Five ACS (International) students completed the challenge and three, namely Lee Yeseo and Celina Isabel Madamba Abueg (Year 1), and Dayoun Moon (Year 3), with Ms Analiza Garcia as their teacherin-charge, were selected. The top 30 videos, each explaining a science phenomenon were shortlisted by a panel of judges from universities, research institutions and professional societies. The videos were open for public voting that contributed to 20% of the total score. In the final round, Celina and Dayoun each received the Bronze Award.

Year 1 Student's Research Project into HBL

Year 1 student Govind Wagle (1 LSG), and his twin brother, Gopal from ACS (Independent) surveyed 69 secondary school students from both local and international schools during the circuit breaker period to investigate the "Psychosocial Impact of Home-based Learning Experience Among Secondary School Students in Singapore During the COVID-19 Pandemic". The majority of students surveyed were male; the female to male ratio was 1:1.46. Approximately three-quarters of the respondents (55, 79.6%) were between 12 and 14 years of age.


Their research methodology and analysis was very sound and most impressive. We append three key graphs of their results which show changes in time spent on different activities before and after HBL; and positive and negative feelings associated with HBL.





Gopal (left) and Govind enjoying their time outdoors

Unsurprisingly, the secondary school students surveyed largely prefer going to school over learning in the home environment, although 11.6% (8/69) preferred HBL over going to school. The researchers conclude that the students surveyed appear to have adapted well to the HBL and had opportunities to develop new skills as well as a positive outlook towards life.

Resumption of CCAs

CCAs at ACS (International) has resumed, following the recent announcement from the MOE regarding the gradual resumption of CCAs. As per the guidelines, all CCAs will be capped at 20 students per activity and within that, students can only work closely in groups of 5 or fewer. This will mean that CCAs can resume but will be modified to follow the Phase 2 guidelines and ensure the safe management measures.

The school will continue to use "SchoolsBuddy" to organise, manage and review the CCA activities of the students. You can also download the SchoolsBuddy app now on your mobile device to receive all of the up to date information about your CCA on the move. For Sports CCAs, a new preference based container on SchoolsBuddy for the upcoming "modified sport CCA season" has been launched.
