

STUDENT SUCCESSES

ACS (International) IGCSE 2015 Examination Results

ACS (International) students in the November 2015 IGCSE examination continued the trend of recent years by exceeding the performance of the previous year. This trend was also observed in the IB Diploma results released two weeks ago. The results were released on 19 January.

ACS (International) students produced a 91.4% pass rate with 53% Distinction passes. This compares to 91% and 90% pass rates in 2014 and 2013 respectively; and 48% and 45% Distinction pass rates respectively. 80% gained entry to our IB Diploma programme by gaining at least 2xA; 2 x B and 2 x C passes (74% in 2014).

Seventeen students in the 133 strong cohort gained all Distinction passes (A * or A) – compared to 12 last year. These top performing students who each gained 100% Distinction passes were Evangeline Leong Li En, Zhu Mengqi, Dhruv Uppal, Chung Yungling Samantha, Chen Siye, Liam Kuok Ke Wei, Lee Hyun Ju, Purinat Atipas, Yang Xiyan, Wang Tianwen, Lyu Shijia, Eric Wen Bo Chao, Lim Jia Jing, Guo Shiyu ,Chen Kaiyuan, Xiang Zhecheng, Quek Xin Zhong Joshua and Hu Yanran.

Top performing subjects included Japanese, Music and Physical Education with 100% pass rates; followed by Mathematics 98%, English Literature 95%, Physics, 94%, Chemistry 94%, Biology 93%, and Business Studies 93%. The highest percentage of distinctions were in Chemistry (75%), Mathematics (70%), Music (67%) and Physics (61%).

Some Language subjects sat their IGCSE papers in May. Their results are very impressive. IGCSE Chinese as First Language had 100% pass rate with 97% Distinctions - 21 A*, 8 A and 1B passes. This is the best result so far since we initiated this subject two years ago. The two students in Malay as a Foreign Language each achieved A*. Chinese as Second Language (May only) also had a 100% pass rate and Mandarin as a Foreign Language (May only) achieved 65% Distinction.

Top of the World results are released later in the year. The school has gained 13 of these prestigious awards over the previous six years in English Literature, English Language, Economics, Mathematics, Additional Mathematics, Geography, Physical Education and Chinese.

The ACS (International) Admissions Office has seen a spike in Year 5 enrolments this year following its recent high 'value added' International Baccalaureate results and 98.7% pass rate. Parents are encouraged to talk to the Admissions Department about the very limited vacancies as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.

We congratulate both students and staff on the impressive and improved IGCSE results.

International Student Singapore Experience

ACS (International)'s first Singapore Experience Programme (SEP) took place on the 30 January 2016. The aim of the Singapore Experience Programme (SEP) was to provide new international students with a genuine Singapore experience to aid their adjustment to their new school and new country. The school worked in partnership with Holland Village Methodist Church with church members as well as the school acting as hosts.

The new students were guided around the famous areas of Singapore and were also exposed to the colorful, unique culture of the people of Singapore. From the historical shops in Chinatown to the tradition-filled lanes of Little India and Kampong Glam, students were given a chance to get to know Singapore better, as well as gain some insight into the exciting history of Singapore.

The programme kicked off at 9am with breakfast and ice-breaker games at Wesley Hall before we departed at 10am to tour Chinatown. There, students were shown around the first temples, churches and worship places. Then, we proceeded to the National Library of Singapore to be given a briefing on the library's application and book reference and borrowing procedures which are undoubtedly important to our knowledge-seeking students.

The tour was, in my opinion, an exhilarating experience filled with not only the laughter and smiles of the students or teachers but also with knowledge we may not ever have acquired if we did not embark on the outing in the first place. It has given me proper insight into the uniqueness of each one of my friends' cultures or religions. Thus, letting the students, including me, understand each other better and have an open-mind when it comes to cultural acceptance which plays an important role in a unique multiracial nation such as Singapore.

I would definitely say that there was not even a single moment wasted as we were constantly acquiring new information and experiences during the trip even while riding on the bus. And frankly, being a frequent visitor to Singapore, I did not realize how much knowledge I lacked about this nation until I embarked on this very outing. Do I regret using up a whole Saturday on one school outing? Not even the slightest bit. Despite the heat and tiring long walks, I'd definitely still say...it's worth it.
