General Office Hours

Direct School Admissions

Prospective students can apply for admission to 2022 classes through our internal admissions tests or based on formal examination results such as PSLE or 'O' Levels taken in 2021. Direct School Admissions (DSA) applicants for Years 1, 2, 3, Pre IB, Foundation IB and Year 5 can contact the Admissions Department to arrange to sit for English Language and Mathematics entrance tests. All applicants will also undertake an oral interview with a senior staff member. Year 1 applicants who do not pass the DSA process can re-apply for admission using their 2021 PSLE results.

Report Grading Policy Change

The school has recently reviewed its policy regarding school reports. Some changes to the policy aim to provide greater clarity to parents about what the various components, such as Subject Attainment, Attitude to Learning and Completion of Work, mean. The updated policy will take effect from Term 3. 
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

Year 4 Student Appointed as Council Chair OPMUN21

The Envoy CCA is proud to announce that Yone Shou Saw (4 GHK) has been selected as a council chair for OPMUN21, an educational conference which focuses on pressing local issues — utilising the traditional Model United Nations (MUN) debate format and unique facilitated breakout sessions to unpack such issues.

Student participants will partake in insightful debates on prevalent social and political issues concerning Singapore – as delegates representing different stakeholders in various local bodies or institutions (e.g. Ministry of Defence in the Singapore Parliament).

OPMUN's mission is to nurture the next generation of Youth Advocates in Singapore. This year, we are guided by the motto "Harmony Brings Happiness". It is based on an old Malay saying "Muafakat bawa Berkat" which roughly translates to as "Consensus brings Blessings". It is a reflection of Singapore as a melting pot, forged together in bringing peace and prosperity with each other – therefore regrouping all sorts of blessings as "Happiness".

OPMUN is officially supported by **OnePeople.sg**, an organisation under the purview of the Ministry of Culture, Community, and Youth (MCCY). **OnePeople.sg** champions multicultural harmony initiatives in Singapore – empowering OPMUN's focus on local issues regarding race, religion and social cohesion.



32nd National Schools Chinese Calligraphy Competition

Lyu Nuo (5 GHK) and Song Yuhan (1 LSG) from Chinese Calligraphy CCA participated in the 32nd National Schools Chinese Calligraphy Competition in April; a competition created as a collaboration between Chinese Calligraphy Society of Singapore and Lianhe Zaobao. It was open to all schools in Singapore and featured 1,357 participants. Of these, only 90 participants reached the finals to compete at the Chinese Calligraphy Society of Singapore on 11 April.

Ultimately, Lyu Nuo was honorably placed second and Song Yuhan fourth in the Senior High and Junior Secondary categories respectively. Both were presented the awards on 1 May and the news was published in Lianhe Zaobao on 4 May. Finishing in the top 4 from over 1,000 participants is by far the best result in our CCA's history, a great acknowledgment of the students' efforts and an encouragement to their fellow students to continue to appreciate Chinese Calligraphy Art.

Student reflections

I enjoyed the competition because whilst I have been writing calligraphy for seven years, this was my first time taking part in a national level competition. As the Chinese saying goes "人外有人,天外有天" which means there is always someone better than us, I have learned a lot in this competition. It allowed me to interact and communicate with people of my age about calligraphy whilst giving me the chance to meet people whose calligraphy skills are better than mine, encouraging me to continue putting effort into it.

I was honoured to represent ACS (International) in the competition and won second prize in the Senior High school group. In the past few years, I have learned a new type of script called "xíng shū", which is highly technical. I used this script in my final calligraphy work in the competition which turned out to be a great success.

This is not only an acknowledgment of my efforts over the years but also of the Chinese Calligraphy CCA that provided me with a great coach and with the opportunity to continue my love of writing calligraphy overseas; whilst supporting me to participate in a variety of competitions. The competition brought together young calligraphy lovers from all over Singapore – we learned from each other by exchanging views, which also broadened my vision. In school, as the captain of Chinese calligraphy CCA, I will continue to take the responsibility of promoting the culture of Chinese calligraphy to encourage more students with the joy of calligraphy.

More Interact Club CAS Projects

Another busy month for us at Interact Club as we roll out various CAS projects. Here are the highlights from two more of our projects.

Project Zumba

As part of our long-term continual partnership with Methodist Welfare Services (MWS), our Interactors embarked on a refreshing and interactive project to create Zumba videos for the beneficiaries in the MWS Nursing Homes and Senior Activity Centres.

To bring some cheer and exercise to these beneficiaries, our Interactors have been meeting twice weekly to create customised Zumba videos. A monthly "Arm-chair Zumba" video, complete with student introductions and an English and Mandarin voice-over, is created for the 450 patients in the nursing homes. Only arm movements are used in this workout as the patients are wheel-chair bound.

For the more mobile elderly beneficiaries in the Senior Activity Centres, a full-body Zumba video is created for their monthly workout. The songs for these videos are tailored specifically to their requests, so the elderly could dance to a familiar tune!







Project "Screen-demic"

In an effort to combat the ills of excessive mobile phone usage, a group of passionate Year 6 Interactors have embarked on a mobile awareness campaign entitled "Screen-demic", a play on the word "pandemic".

The students get together in Google Meetings to discuss the negative impact of the device which we all cannot seem to live without, and have taken the time to write essays on this issue, in the hopes to spread greater awareness in our school community.

Students can access their essays through the Screen-demic posters put up around school. The group will be contributing one essay per month to be featured in our monthly school newsletter. Have a read of the first essay in the side box.



Pedestrian Distractions

The usage of mobile phones have been growing controllably in the past decade. The average person spends about 4.5 hours a day on their mobile phones in 2020 and checks their phones about 58 times a day. The time spent on mobile phones per day is increasingly putting people at tremendous risk especially when commuting.



Many students from our school have been seen crossing the road while using their mobile devices or listening to music which makes them oblivious to their surroundings. This is the cause of an increasing number of accidents between vehicles and pedestrians not only around our school but in other areas as well.

This is an incredibly serious issue which has caught the attention of traffic police who have updated the highway code - a code of conduct for all road users - to include an advisory against this behaviour known as "distracted walking". "Pedestrians should avoid using mobile communication devices while crossing the road", said the advisory.

As the Mobile Awareness advocacy group, we would also like to do something to resolve this problem which concerns the safety of our students. We hope you will participate and support our cause of ensuring the safety of our students when commuting to and from school.














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SPORTS NEWS

A Gratitude a Day Keeps the Doctors Away

Thanksgiving is still many months away, but it's a good time to think about gratitude. Leading gratitude researcher, Robert Emmons, defines gratitude as the ability to recognise the goodness in your life. A grateful perspective is especially critical during moments of crisis, such as the current COVID-19 pandemic. Gratitude helps us sustain a positive attitude in the midst of uncertainty and fear. Gratitude energises, heals, and brings us hope. Gratitude fosters resilience and helps us endure difficulties and challenges. During times of unpredictability, gratitude helps us focus on things we can control and what we can do. The benefits of gratitude extend beyond mental health and wellness. One study found that being grateful resulted in significantly fewer physical health problems such as sleep disturbances, headaches, gastrointestinal problems, and respiratory infections.

During the June holidays, try practising gratitude in simple ways. For example, you can start a gratitude journal by writing down one thing you are thankful for each day. You can do this on your own or with friends. You can also go around the dinner table and share what you are thankful for with your family. You can let someone know that you are grateful for them – send them a thank-you card, text, or email. Try starting or ending each day naming three things that you are thankful for. Finally, remember that gratitude isn't just for the big things in life. You can show gratitude for simple things like a sunny day with blue skies, a cup of fresh orange juice in the morning, or having a friend to chat with.
