IBDP Examination 2023 Results

ACS (International) students achieved a pass rate of 96.55% and an average score of 36.09 for the IBDP. This average is likely to be revised upwards after the appeal process is completed.

More than 90% of students scored above the world average of 30.24 (May figure), and 19.5% of students achieved a score of 40 or more.

The following students achieved a perfect score of 45 points for the IBDP examination:

- Conrad Trey Indradjaja Indonesia
- Eunwoo Jung South Korea
- Dayoun Moon South Korea

The top performing subjects, defined by over 50% of students achieving a grade 7, are as follows:

- Chinese B Higher Level
- Chinese B Standard Level
- Business Management Higher Level
- Mandarin Ab Initio Standard Level
- Theatre Higher Level

Congratulations to the students for all their achievements. The school offers its thanks and appreciation to all the staff for the hard work they put into these students during their time with the school.

Drop Off and Pick Up from School

For the safety of all, we seek the co-operation of all parents driving to school to exercise care and consideration by adhering to the following:

- Turn off your engines when waiting to pick up your child from school. With many cars waiting outside the school, the noise of car engines can be quite disturbing to the residents.
- Drive at a safe speed that is below the legal speed limit along the roads near school. The pavements are narrow and often blocked which results in pedestrians, including young children, having to walk on the road. Drivers should be mindful of this and reduce their speed.
- Reduce speed when it is raining in order not to spray puddles of water at students and members of the public who are walking close by.
- Refrain from waiting/parking illegally. It is an offence to park/wait on either side of a road demarcated by a continuous white line or double yellow lines.

- Please do not beep your horn to get your child's attention; this is a noise nuisance to our neighbours.
- Plan your pick-up time with your child to reduce the queuing/waiting time along the road.
- Avoid arriving earlier than the scheduled school dismissal time.
- Do not park in front of the access of any residential unit.
- Be considerate and allow cars from side roads access into the car queue waiting to exit to Holland Village.
- Parents are encouraged to make use of the back gate (Gate C) via Holland Close as a much less congested alternative to drop off your child (see below map for details).



13th Student Ambassadors Volunteered with Habitat for Humanity

This year, the 13th Student Ambassadors managed to raise \$26,095 for Habitat for Humanity Singapore through its annual fundraiser Choice To Run 2023. As part of our effort to better grasp the work of Habitat for Humanity Singapore and its impact, we participated in the local Project HomeWorks program on Saturday 11 November 2023, under the guidance of volunteer leader Mr Chen.

We were split into two teams, and my team, consisting of five students and a teacher, took on the task of cleaning the kitchen for a low-income family. What seemed like a simple job turned out to be more complex than expected.

We spent a significant amount of time decluttering the kitchen, getting rid of expired goods and unused kitchen equipment. We noticed an abundance of items like big bottles of oil, detergents, and instant noodles, many of which were long past their expiry dates. Surprisingly, these turned out to be gifts from other charity organisations, intended to help the family but gathering dust instead. Once the kitchen was cleared, we worked together to clean it thoroughly. We split tasks, with someone washing dishes, others cleaning tiles and the stove, and some sweeping and mopping the floor. Teamwork played a part, and we managed to get the kitchen in order despite needing to take short breaks as the task appeared quite overwhelming for us.

A noteworthy moment was when Mr. Chen convinced the homeowner to let go of a rusty oven. It made us realise that some families hold onto things for a sense of security, a point we were briefed about earlier but hadn't fully understood until now. Seeing the struggles this family faced made me more grateful for what I have. It reinforced the importance of resilience and the collective goal of helping the community. It also opened our eyes and taught us to empathise with the family's situation and appreciate the impact of lending a helping hand. I am glad we spent a meaningful morning in this way.



The GC package comes with the TI-Nspire CX II (non-CAS) calculator, charging cable and the TI-Nspire CX student software license code for installing the software in your computer. Students should keep this license code safely for future use. All students who purchased a TI-Nspire CX II (non-CAS) model graphing calculator earlier need not buy again. Those who do not have a working graphing calculator are strongly recommended to purchase it during this sale. Year 1 and 1Bridging students do not need a graphical calculator and they should not buy it.




