## Accreditation Outcomes

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The school recently underwent its five year re-accreditation visits from both the International Baccalaureate (IB) and the Council of International Schools (CIS).

I am pleased to report the following outcomes to you:

### **International Baccalaureate**

The school has been re-authorised to offer the IB Diploma Programme, with no “Matters to be addressed”.

Our school’s average rating was “Shows development beyond requirements”, which is the highest rating that the IB awards for each component in this process.

### **Council of International Schools**

ACS (International) has been awarded re-accreditation status with no “Supplementary reporting requirements”.

The school met every Standard across all Domains and the school was rated as “Exceeded” for 6 of the Standards, the most the school has achieved.
